1. Validity of the meeting and presence of a quorum

The Karsten group currently collaborates with various instances within TUCS, on national level, and internationally. They have performed several external funded projects. The working plan reflects the kind of activity that TUCS should support. Therefore, the new laboratory should be established.

<u>Proposal</u>: TUCS will establish the ZETA Laboratory lead by professor Eija Karsten.

<u>Decision</u>: The item was left on the table. In the discussion, more information was

needed regarding connections to existing laboratories, especially to HMII.

The focus of the laboratory should also be clearly expressed.

According to the decision by the Ministry of Education TUCS has a new Graduate School coordinator position 1.1.2007-31.12.2011. This position should be declared open so that the selected applicant could be hired from the beginning 2007. The main responsibility of the new person would be the implementation of the TUCS strategy as described in the GS application to the Ministry of Education. The main tasks, which are heavily interdependent, include implementation of the planned mentor programme for GS students, development of international cooperation in education, and development of thematic research programmes compatible with both local and EU level strategies.

<u>Proposal</u>: A GS coordinator position will be declared open. The salary will be negotiated according to the new salary system.

Decision: The item was left on the table. A more specific job description of the

coordinator was asked for.
