1. Validity of the meeting and presence of a quorum

4. Complaint from the application round 2008 (Tenhunen)

Mr. Markus Voltti, M.Sc. has filed a complaint on January 9, 2009 concerning the latest TUCS application round for funded TUCS graduate positions. The application deadline was for the latest round of applications March 23, 2008.

<u>Proposal</u>: Mr. Voltti's complaint concerns the correctness of the evaluation of his application.

TUCS Board has asked, through the Graduate School Director, the Graduate School Committee to carry out a revision of Mr Voltti's application. The TUCS Graduate School Committee found at its meeting on January 26, 2009 that the evaluation of Mr Voltti's application had been carried out in accordance with the guidelines decided by the TUCS Board on December 17, 2007.

TUCS Board concludes that Mr. Voltti's application was evaluated according to TUCS Board defined guidelines. Therefore no further actions with respect to the earlier TUCS Board (12.5.2008) decision on the funded TUCS Graduate School positions are needed.

Decision: According to proposal.

Teijo Lehtonen wanted to add a motion to the proposal, regarding granting a TUCS GS salary position for 6 months. The motion was seconded by Tuukka Simonen.

The Board did not take the motion under consideration as it did not address the handling of the complaint.

5. Updating of the evaluation criteria (Jääskeläinen)

TUCS GS Committee has discussed the evaluation criteria in the meeting January 26, 2009, and concluded to propose a number of modifications for the spring 2009 application round.

<u>Proposal</u>: The Board will accept the suggested changes to the evaluation criteria.

<u>Decision</u>: According to proposal with some minor changes. The Chair of the Graduate School Committee, the leader of TUCS GS and the Coordinator

will formulate the final version. The final version can be found in appendix $\frac{4a/01/09}{2}$.

6. Flexible starting time of the doctoral studies at TUCS (Jääskeläinen)

The general practice of TUCS has been that the studies and the TUCS funding will start at the beginning of September after the spring application round. However, this practice has been noticed to impractical, as often some students would like to start earlier and some later. Few expections have been made already before based on a request from the supervisor.

<u>Proposal:</u> The general instruction will still be that the studies and funding at TUCS will start September 1, but with a good reason the start can take place between June 1 and December 1. If the student wants to start at another time than September 1, he/she must make a written request together with his/her supervisor to TUCS Director as soon as possible after the admission decisions have been published.

Decision: According to proposal.

7. Language requirement of the international applicants (Jääskeläinen)

The current rule of TUCS is that the English language test will not be required from applicants, who have conducted their secondary education in Finland, in the EU countries, in the U.S, the UK, Ireland, Canada, Australia, New Zealand or in South Africa, nor from the applicants, who have completed a Master's Degree (minimum of two years Master's programme) in the EU, the U.S, Canada, Australia, New Zealand or in South Africa and English has been the main medium of instruction in that Master's programme.

The limits for the language tests are as follows:

Applicants of the University of Turku:

IELTS: Average 6.5; no individual scores below 5.5. TOEFL: 550 points (paper based total) or 232 points (computer based total) or 90 points (iBT total).

Applicants of the Åbo Akademi University:

IELTS: Average 6.5; no individual scores below 5.5.

TOEFL: 575 points (paper based total) or 232 points (computer based total) or 90 points (iBT total).

Applicants of the Turku School of Economics:

IELTS: Average 6.5; no individual scores below 5.5. TOEFL: 575 points (paper based total) or 232 points (computer based total) or 90 points (iBT total).

The original test result must be sent to TUCS by the testing center (TOEFL with TUCS code 8410).

<u>Proposal</u>: TUCS intends to fund in the first place doctoral students of the University of Turku, Åbo Akademi University and Turku School of Economics. Therefore a language test is not required from applicants, who have already obtained the right for doctoral studies at one of the universities within TUCS community. In addition, applicants, who have conducted their secondary education or two-year Master's Degree Programme in the EU, the U.S.A, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, the UK, Ireland or South-Africa, are also waived from the English language test.

The only accepted language tests are TOEFL and IELTS, and the test score must come directly from the testing centre. The minimum test scores are the same as in international Master's degree programs at UTU, ÅAU and TSE. The tests that are accepted and the minimum test scores for TUCS Graduate School (independent of the universities) are:

IELTS: Average 6.5; no individual scores below 5.5. TOEFL: 575 points (paper based total) or 232 points (computer based total) or 90 points (iBT total).

Decision: According to proposal.
