1. Validity of the meeting and presence of a quorum

The notice of a board meeting has to be sent three weekdays before the meeting takes place. The meeting must be valid and the members present have to constitute a quorum. The meeting constitutes a quorum when the chairman and at least five members of the board are present.

3. TUCS Graduate School funding decision (Salakoski)

In the previous Board meeting it was decided that 8-12 new students with max 2 years funding from TUCS could be accepted to TUCS GS. In this application round TUCS GS received a total of 42 applications, 21 from Finns and 21 from foreigners. TUCS GS

Committee has evaluated the applicants according to the evaluation criteria for 2009. Based on these evaluations and taking into account other issues such as the matching funding principle and suggested funding arrangements, the balance between the participating universities and departments, the genus perspective, interest toward the suggested reseach plan by TUCS supervisors, and the suggested supervision arrangements, the following proposal has been prepared.

- <u>Proposal</u>: 6 funded positions with 2 years of funding and 1 funded position with 1 year of funding, will be granted in this application round as shown in appendix 01a/03/09 provided that the conditions stated therein are met and 4 year fulltime graduate study funding can be arranged. In addition, 11 new TUCS status positions will be granted provided that adequate supervision and funding for 4 year fulltime graduate study can be arranged.
- <u>Decision</u>: According to the proposal. The TUCS Graduate School steering group granted TUCS GS status starting September 1st, 2009 to the following students provided that they have or will receive the right to pursue doctoral studies at one of the universities in Turku. If the student wants to start at another time than September 1st, he/she must make a written request together with his/her supervisor to TUCS Director. If the request is accepted the start can take place between June 1st and December 1st 2009.

On February 2nd, 2009 the Board decided that all application documents must reach TUCS Office by the application deadline (March 31st, 2009). The Board discussed each individual case of delayed documents and agreed on that the applications can be accepted in this application round, since no relevant information in terms of the evaluation were missing from the documents received by the deadline. The Board also discussed about one applicant who's research interest was out of scope for TUCS GS.

Tuomo Saarni announced a dissenting opinion to the minutes on the following issues: the acceptance of applications complemented after the deadline; and that only the ranking list without the pre-evaluation points from the Graduate School Committee as well as the funding and supervison plan for students were supplied with the call for the meeting.

7.4 TUCS Short Course

The invited lectures were Field Application Engineer Bo Asklund from Acal Technology Ab, Sweden and Roger Mellander from ABB Corporation Research, Sweden.
